We always encourage you to Dream Big, and that includes living in a neighborhood we can all be proud which starts with Showing Kindness to our neighbours.

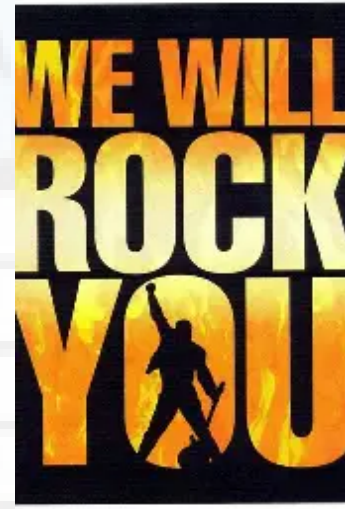
